WHO CAN APPLY?

Registered charities, including charitable incorporated organisations

- Constituted organisations and non-registered charities
- Community interest companies and community benefit societies
- Non-constituted or recently established organisations that can be endorsed by a statutory body, established charity, parochial church council or parish/town council
- Parish and Town Councils (if the activity is not deemed part of their statutory duties)
- Churches and other religious organisations (if the activity is not deemed to be proselytising)
- Partnerships or organisations working collaboratively can apply. The lead applicant would need to be one of the above

WHAT CAN BE FUNDED?

- Projects that have been established due to an increase in demand as a direct response to the pandemic
- Projects that have been changed, or adapted, as a direct response to the pandemic and where additional costs are being incurred
- Organisations that have experienced a loss of funding as a direct result of the pandemic including, but not limited to, general fundraising, the need to close services or postpone projects which would normally generate an income
- Organisations who have had their operations impacted by the pandemic

Appendix II - Covid 19 funding announcements

<u>Arts Council England</u> - announces coronavirus crisis plan to compensate out-of-pocket artists and institutions. Funding conditions suspended for at least 3 months and advance payment of grant funding to assist cash flow.

<u>Community Foundation NI</u> - launched a Coronavirus Community Fund for community organisations emergency funding to deal with emerging issues in the community, affecting older people (aged 50 and over)

<u>North West Volunteer Centre NI</u> - community organisations - older people (aged 50 and over), as a result of the continuing threat of coronavirus, and the need for self-isolation, and potential for further exacerbation of loneliness and isolation.

Bedfordshire & Luton Community Foundation - in final stages of planning as a Sunday evening.

<u>Cambridgeshire Coronavirus Community Fund</u> - £1k - £5k, older people (aged 60 and over) and other vulnerable people (high risk, pre-existing medical conditions), including the need for self-isolation, financial hardship, potential for hunger, lack of shelter, further exacerbation of health issues, loneliness and isolation.

<u>Cheshire Community Foundation</u> - activities that help vulnerable people self-isolating, provide funding to coordinate community response and support volunteers, and increase capacity for organisations providing emergency support, such as foodbanks or benefits advice.

<u>Community Foundation for Calderdale</u>- initial priority - grants of £1000 to local charities to help the most vulnerable.

<u>Community Foundation for Staffordshire</u> - funding for organisations that support vulnerable members of our communities, which are finding it difficult to operate.

<u>Cumbria Community Foundation</u> - funding to charitable projects supporting people affected by the virus, helping to keep them safe and supported in their homes and reducing pressure on the NHS.

<u>Community Southwark</u> - Coronavirus Help Fund - community organisations and local charities, for £5k-20k for specific coronavirus poverty relief projects.

<u>Devon Community Foundation</u> - Devon Coronavirus Response and Recovery Fund - local charities and community organisations, in two stages: response, then recovery.

<u>Dorset Coronavirus Community Fund</u> - charities, community groups and organisations who support vulnerable groups affected by the Coronavirus outbreak.

<u>Foundation Derbyshire's Coronavirus Fund</u> - community groups and organisations - initial focus on food banks and befriending services.

<u>Heart of England Community Foundation</u> - Coronavirus resilience Fund appeal to help champion local communities and projects.

<u>Heart of Bucks Community Foundation</u> - Coronavirus Response Appeal today (21 March) to support people and charities in Buckinghamshire who are most affected and vulnerable at this time of crisis.

Quartet Community Foundation - West of England, Coronavirus Response Fund, grants up to £5k - elderly (aged 65 and over), people with disabilities and/or underlying health difficulties, homeless people, low income families, refugees and asylum seekers, people experiencing food poverty.

<u>Suffolk Community Foundation</u> - older people at risk (typically over the age of 70), vulnerable people with medical conditions, those that are isolated and therefore have limited support networks, those picking up extra demand – such as food banks, telephone befriending, and advice services, good neighbourhood schemes.

<u>Somerset Community Foundation</u> - Somerset Coronavirus Response and Recovery Fund. Grants to be made on a rolling basis, beginning as soon as funds become available.

<u>Two Ridings Community Foundation</u> - up to £2k, community organisations preparing themselves to appropriately respond, development of advice and support initiatives to fill gaps, groups that provide vital community support.

<u>Wiltshire and Swindon Coronavirus Response Fund</u> - prioritise groups supporting individuals who are most affected by the outbreak, particularly those facing issues brought about by isolation or loss of income.

<u>Worthing Community Chest</u> - grants of up to £250 for small, ad hoc, neighbourhood projects that have been set up in response to the coronavirus.
