OBSERVING SHABBAT AND JEWISH FESTIVALS

The Jewish Sabbath begins at sunset each Friday and ends at nightfall each Saturday evening. Likewise, Jewish festivals begin at sunset the evening before and conclude the following evening at nightfall. During Shabbat and major festivals (in capitals above) a Jewish person is not permitted to work, cook, transact any business, sit an examination, ride in a vehicle, use tools, electrical or mechanical equipment, handle money, write etc and they should be allowed to leave work, school, etc in sufficient time to be able to arrive safely home before the beginning of Shabbat or festivals.

President's Report

When I wrote my last President's Report for the 2020 Year Book I never dreamt that nearly one year on we would be in the equivalent of "Groundhog Day."

Little did any of us know that one year on from the events last March, the whole world (never mind the Jewish one) would still be turned upside down and all the things which the members of the community took for granted, have now been curtailed or severely compromised for over a year.

Last year, with Pesach looming large on the horizon, we quickly became aware: of the need to ensure provision of sufficient kosher Pesach food; that we would have the volunteers to service the community; that people's security dare not be compromised; that funerals would need arranging and Zoom shiva houses would suddenly become the norm.

As has been well documented, the Council, in cooperation with the CST, set up what has become the Strategic Group, now chaired by Mark Adlestone OBE DL.

This committee comprises all the major service providers: The Fed; The Nicky; Maccabi; Hershel Weis Centre; representatives from the Manchester Beth Din; the kosher food stores; Hatzola; Misaskim; JVN; the Jewish security services - CST and Shomrim; the food banks and most importantly, representatives from local Government and the Bury South MP, Christian Wakeford; as well as representatives from

the Board of Deputies, the JLC and local Rabbonim. Now over a year on it comprises over 30 organisations and regularly has an excess of over 40 people in attendance.

This committee immediately sprang into action and provided the platform that kept the community functioning throughout the pandemic. It has become so successful, that all being well, when the pandemic has subsided, it will continue to function and provide the exceptional service that the community has continued to receive throughout the crisis. One of the pros of this whole period is that the level of cooperation and collaboration from all aspects of our community means that in future, we hopefully will be able to use this group to foster greater achdut (unity) within the Community.

The Council, in its 100 years, has always been at the forefront of communal life and the crisis has provided the opportunity not only to lead locally, but going forward it is hoped that this will also happen nationally.

As a Council we are determined to play our part in creating a better platform for the youth in our community. Mental health has been one of the greatest challenges of the pandemic and if the crisis has taught us anything, it is that there must be changes within the community.

The JRC is ready to play its part in developing new strategies for the community. As I write we have a route out of the crisis, but none of us is totally sure how long this road will be. Hopefully by the next Yomim Noraim we will be able to be together with our family and friends and celebrate as normal.

In the meantime, we will come together after Shavuot and thank all the unsung heroes from so many service organisations who have worked tirelessly day and night to ensure that this community not only was able to function, but despite all the hardships, have become an exemplar to the rest of the wider community.

May I take this opportunity to thank my colleagues: Jacky Buchsbaum (Chair); Susan Isaacs (who heads the Youth and Community Division); Graham Gordon (who heads the Publicity Division); Jay Charara (Vice Chair, who heads the PR Division); Jeremy Michelson (Vice Chair, who heads the Education Division); Michael Rubinstein (who heads the Anti-Semitism Division); as well as the members of the Executive Committee and Laurie Burnley-Myers (Administrator) for all their hard work and dedication throughout the crises. The support you have provided has been exceptional.

May I also thank Christian Wakeford MP for Bury South, The Local Councillors of Bury and Salford, the members of Bury and Salford Council and GMCA and last but certainly not least Marc Levy of the JLC and Sara Radivan of the Board of Deputies for all your hard work on behalf of the Council - we could not function without you.

From Reform Judaism:

This year, more than ever, we are delighted to have the opportunity to thank the Representative Council for their invaluable work.

Over the past number of years, the JLC has built extremely close relationships with regional communities. Through our locally based regional managers, we have led on the political engagement establishing and maintaining contacts with elected representatives. Following the 2019 General Election, we have formally spoken with all the newly elected MPs from your region. As an umbrella organisation, a key component of our work is highlighting the amazing achievements of our members to government. It is a source of great pride that our members operate at the highest possible standard serving the vibrant and thriving Greater Manchester community.

In March 2020, as the pandemic and lockdown took hold, we witnessed how the Greater Manchester community responded in an unprecedented manner. Emergency Care Home Appeal that assisted The Fed and all other Jewish care homes based in the UK. Our Social Care Assistance Fund provided financial relief to over twenty charities of which six were solely based in Greater Manchester. Finally, alongside Work Avenue, we launched an Emergency Assistance Fund to assist individuals who were in financial distress due to being self-employed or falling between government assistance. Dozens of families across Greater Manchester received individual donations up to £2,500.

Over the coming 12 months, there will be undoubted challenges faced by the community as we return to some semblance of normality. Jewish people across Greater Manchester and the country should be reassured that the JLC will continue to work closely with the Representative Council to advocate for our community.






